## Cash Learning Partnership (CaLP) Level 2 Training in Pakistan


Training Title: CaLP Level 2 Training for the Cash Working Group in Pakistan

Date: 30<sup>th</sup> May to 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2016

Pakistan Cash Working Group under the umbrella of Food Security Cluster has organised a five days CaLP level 2 training. A regular feature of CWG is to develop a capacity building plan for CWG members. In this 5-day CaLP level 2 training conducted at national level, CWG members of I/NGOs and UN Organizations, National and Provincial level staff have participated.

Ms. Inès DALMAU GUTSENS was the lead trainer from CaLP Roster. She is a humanitarian aid professional with over 17 years of experience in assessment, programme design, implementation and evaluation. She has worked in relief, recovery and long-term development programs covering post-conflict, slow-onset and sudden disasters.

She has particular expertise in the livelihoods sector, CTP and robust experience in capacity building. She has often adopted innovative approaches such as CTP in SRC, and "on-line with tutor" trainings for the IFRC-LRC.





Ms. Rabeea Ahmed has trained as a trainer on CaLP level 2 training by CaLP international. She has co-facilitated both the CaLP Level 2 Trainings in Pakistan and Nepal. She is the Pakistan CWG Co-Lead from WFP.

This 5-day training package aims to take humanitarian practitioners and support staff with cash experience to the next level when coordinating, planning, implementing and Monitoring & Evaluation cash transfer programming, as well as to facilitate information sharing on best practices. Covering a broad cross-section of modalities is looking at the lessons learned and innovations from recent cash-based disaster response programmes in Pakistan and other countries.

The objective of the Level 2 training is to strengthen the capacity of humanitarian actors in cash transfer programme design and implementation, to share recent research and learning, and encourage advocacy, institutionalization and coordination in cash transfer programming (CTP).

- 1. Make evidence based decisions on the appropriateness and feasibility of CTP
- 2. Rationalise and justify the use of different transfer modalities to meet different programme objectives
- 3. Manage programmes with greater skill and confidence throughout the CTP process
- 4. Determine transfer modalities and delivery mechanisms
- 5. Advocate for CTP in appropriate contexts

FAO and WFP as CWG Co-Lead have coordinated the training. FAO was responsible for all arrangements, participants boarding and lodgings, per day, travel expense, food, supplies and equipment, translations (if any), copies, communications, etc. and stakeholders' involvement through invitation. The training was funded by ECHO.
