

# SOCIAL PROTECTION AND CTP TRAINING COURSE

## Part 2: Designing Humanitarian Cash-based assistance linked to Social Assistance

This full-day training session covers the key processes/steps involved in designing humanitarian assistance that contributes to strengthening/developing social assistance systems in the country. This follows the project cycle from assessment, through design, implementation and learning, and provides clarity on the role of humanitarian actors in linking humanitarian assistance with social assistance. This training is based on the CaLP publication '*Working with Cash Based Safety Nets in Humanitarian Contexts*'.

Please note that this course assumes prior knowledge of CTP concepts and application. It is not suitable for participants who have no experience of Humanitarian CTP.

### Course Length

This is a one day face to face training course. Please note this course is also available as an [online, self-directed e-learning course](#). You will need to register on Kaya to access the course, along with other CaLP online material. The online course takes approximately 3-4 hours to complete.

### Key learning outcomes

At the end of the module participants will have:

- Knowledge of key steps and considerations involved in designing humanitarian assistance that contribute to strengthening/developing social protection systems in the country;
- Clarity on the role of humanitarian actors in linking humanitarian assistance with social protection in general and cash based social safety nets in particular.

### Intended Audience

Participants for this session should have ideally have attended the introductory session, (Part 1) or have equivalent basic knowledge of the topic (e.g. read the accompanying guidance). The general target audience for this session is humanitarian practitioners who have little or no experience of working with social protection, but understand the basic concepts and opportunities, and want to learn more about how they might apply this in humanitarian programming. It is assumed that participants of this course will already have a working knowledge of Cash Transfer Programming
